The widow *Martha Grigg*, was pensioned under act of July 21. 1848 for five years ending 25 July 1852, and said pension was renewed under act July 3. 1853, for five years longer; but she again married on the 22 January 1856.

Declaration of *Martha Kimbro*, before a J.P. of Bond Co, Ills Oct 19. 1859. is the Guardian of *Elizabeth*

of *Joseph W. Grigg dec'd* who was a private of Comp'y E. 3^d Regt Ills Vol's during the war with Mexico - states when he entered the service and when he was killed therein (25 July 1847-) that deponent received a pension under the acts of 1848 and 1853, but married *David Kimbro* on the 22 Jan'y 1856 - makes the application for pension as guardian of the two children above referred to.
